#### Science Quiz Bowl Trial Event Rules (updated 11/05/18) New York State Science Olympiad

New York State Science Olympiad

 1. DESCRIPTION: This event will test a team's ability to answer questions related to all areas of STEM.

 A TEAM OF UP TO: 3

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# 2. EVENT PARAMETERS:

- a. Each participant must bring pencils and/or pens. Participants are not allowed to bring any other resources or notes.
- b. The event supervisor will create the written exam.
- c. The event supervisor will provide the Buzzer System for Part II.

## 3. <u>THE COMPETITION</u>:

### **Part I: The Written Exam:**

a. All teams will have 50 minutes to take a paper/pencil test.

- b. The paper and pencil test will be composed of 100-200 questions consisting of four groups of 25-50 questions each from the following categories: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Earth Science.
- c. All questions will be created by the event supervisor.
- d. Each team's score on Part I will rank all other teams from 7th place and beyond.

## Part II: Science Bowl:

- a. The six top teams from Part I: The Written Exam will compete in a 50-minute Science Bowl. This may be in front of an audience.
- b. This part may be conducted in one of two different formats:
  - i. Format #1: Only one team at a time may answer a question. If the first team answers incorrectly only one more team may attempt an answer the question.
  - ii. Format #2: All teams can answer each question and earn points for their correct answers. A program for this format is highly recommended.
- c. Each team will designate a Captain who may have the responsibility of giving the final answer for each question depending upon the format chosen.
- d. Depending upon the format chosen (3.II.b,) answers may be provided either only by the team captain or by any participating team member.
- e. Regardless of the format, any participant may "buzz in" using their individual remote response pads/buzzers.
- f. The event supervisor will ask a question and the participants will have until the end of the Answer Time to provide an answer. The Answer Time may range from 10-20 seconds. The Answer Time will be the same for all questions and be announced at the start of Part II.
- g. The competition will continue until all questions have been answered or 50 minutes of competition has elapsed.
- h. Ties after the time has elapsed will be using a selection of Bonus questions between the tied teams. The format to be used will be 'sudden death' and continue until the tie is broken.

### 4. <u>SCORING</u>:

- a. Highest overall score wins.
- b. The Overall score will be calculated by combining the scores from Part I and Part II.
- c. The score for Part I will be calculated as follows:
  - i. Each question is worth 1 point.
  - ii. Time will be the tiebreaker.
  - iii. The six (6) highest scoring teams on Part I will compete in Part II. All other teams will receive a Zero (0) for their Part II score.
- d. The score for Part II depends upon the format used for Part II. The scores will be calculated as follows:
  - i. Format #1 Score Calculation:
    - (1) Each correct answer is worth 10 points.
    - (2) Each incorrect answer is worth -10 points.
    - (3) If teams are tied when time elapses a "sudden death" round using Bonus Questions will be used.
  - ii. Format #2 Score Calculation:
    - (1) "Ringing In" and answering questions are considered one and the same action.
    - (2) Each correct answer earns points.
    - (3) The faster a correct answer is given the more points that answer earns for that question.
    - (4) Each incorrect answer earns no point deduction.
    - (5) If teams are tied when time elapses a "sudden death" round using Bonus Questions will be used.
